The library community room, teen room, and soho room were used 37 times between 12/26 and 1/30. The library computers were used approximately 567 times and the library issued 14 new library cards during the same period.

Some of the groups that have used the rooms include the Quilters, two Girl Scout troops, Boy Scouts, an ARC Literary Group, the Cairo Historical Society, the Greene County Women's League, sewing group, the Cairo Chamber of Commerce, veterans and book club. The rooms have also been used by individual tutors and literacy volunteers and by individuals needing private space to meet with a health insurance consultant.

The library has a Save Energy, Save Dollars workshop coming up on March 30 at 6:00pm with Cornell Co-operative Extension. Participants will receive 3 free CFL bulbs.

The library will be doing some story times at the Cairo Head Start. Last year we had story time at the S. Cairo facility.

The library co-hosted an open mic last week with community radio station WGXC. About forty-five folks turned out, in zero degree weather, including Irish step dancers, a banjo player, poets, guitarists and singers.

The Zumba program was very popular bringing some people into the library for the first time.

The library is still raffling off a handcrafted light house and gazebo donated by Dean Lavin's Uncle Julio. Tickets are \$1 apiece or 6 for \$5.

The Library is also raffling off a yoga mat donated by Elizabeth Brinckerhoff: \$1.00 for two tickets.

The next movie showing is The Judge on March 29 at 1:00pm.

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The Library will hold the next Trustee meeting at 9:30am on Tuesday, March 10.

Re: Report of the Planning Board for the Month of February 2015

On February 5, 2015, the planning board held its regular monthly meeting. There was one public hearing on the Hilgendorff subdivision proposal scheduled and held. Subsequent to the hearing, the project was approved.

There was one other pending subdivision project that appeared before the board for a pre-application review.

In new business, there were two potential site plan applicants that appeared before the board. First, a not-for-profit entity entitled the Freehold Art Exchange provided the board with a sketch plan for an artist colony. Second, Mr. Steven Wagar inquired into the feasibility of converting the currently closed Lantern Motel property on CR 23B in South Cairo into two bedroom apartments. Because of the town's moratorium on conversion of motels, etc., into any other use, he was referred to the town board. Finally, Mrs. Kathleen O'Keefe submitted a sketch plan on a two lot subdivision on property she owns off Anthony Drive.

The board's next regular meeting will be on March 5, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.

From the desk of Town of Cairo Tax Collector

February 27, 2015

To: Supervisor Banta & the Cairo Town Board

Re: Tax Collector's Monthly Report

- Tax collection continued to go smoothly as we entered the penalty phase beginning February 1, 2015. Taxpayers are becoming more aware of the online payment system, and more have utilized this option to date than in the same time period last year. I think out-of-towners really appreciate this option.
- As mentioned in last month's report, the town's portion of the tax warrant in the amount of \$3,835,908.46 has been paid in full.
- A check for January interest was paid to the town in the amount of \$125.46. On or before the 15th of each month, I will continue to pay the interest accrued and late fees collected as stipulated by law.
- A check was sent to the Greene County Treasurer on February 12, 2015 in the amount of \$1,150,000.00 to go toward the county tax warrant as mandated by law.
- All tax payments received to date have been recorded into the BAS system and posted
 to the Warrant Book. I have been in contact with Mike deBenedictus, the Receiver of
 Taxes for Catskill, in regard to posting to the yellow pages (duplicate bills). In lieu of
 doing this, he creates a bound report at the end of the collection season with all the
 information needed. He assures me this is far more cost-effective and just as useful. I
 will be taking a trip to his office to take a look at this idea.
- Please refer to the attached collection summary for statistics related to the tax bill collection as of February 27, 2015.
- Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns regarding the Tax Office.

March 2, 2015




Highway Daily Tasks Performed:

- 1. Snow and ice maintenance ongoing. We have used 1875.85 tons of salt this snow/ice season to date.
- 2. Hauling stone dust (abrasives) for snow and ice control. 3352.32 tons hauled this snow/ice season.
- 3. Road sand/stone dust and salt is being mixed and stockpiled.
- 4. Crews are out cold patching as weather permits.
- 5. Repairs continuing on snow/ice removal equipment.
- 6. Road side trash clean up continues daily.

- 7. Sign maintenance ongoing.
- 8. Highway building electrical wiring and panels are currently being updated to meet state code.
- 9. Renovations/updating at highway building continues
- 10. Brush/limb cutting continues as weather permits.
- 11. Main Street/Town Hall Campus's snow removal continues after storms.
- 12. Cairo Fire Department requested that we not stockpile Town Hall Campus snow on their vacant lot adjacent to the town drainage system.
- 13. Plow maintenance: replacing blades, shoes, etc.
- 14. Central Hudson are moving poles on the upper part of Silver Spur Road
- 15. Temporarily repaired catch basin by the Cairo fire house
- 16. Hired company to perform core samples on the large Sandy Plains FEMA project.

Town Hall Renovations/Repairs:



- 1. Continue to install code compliant wiring to all offices. ie: electric, phone, data, fax
- 2. Installed bullet proof window and drop box at the court office
- 3. Court offices painted, new metal door installed between court office and court room, thin luan door replaced with heavy metal door from prisoner holding area to court room.
- 4. Prisoner benches installed in holding room
- 5. IT technicians continue to install data communications
- 6. Garnet personnel began new phone system installation
- 7. Restroom ductwork complete, motion sensor installed.
- 8. Installed weather stripping on all emergency exit doors.

- 9. Sewer line to town hall building was plugged. Hunter environmental was called to pump out line.
- 10. Repairs were made to alarm system.
- 11. Reconfigured HVAC in the court office.
- 12.Installed new data/telephone cabling in court room.



Meeting & Miscellaneous

- 1. Still pending: F450 crew cab complete with snow and ice equipment, snow plow for F350 Unit 1, skid steer with snow blower, pricing double drum roller and tandem dump trucks with snow and ice equipment.
- 2. Still pending: Repairs to salt building.
- 3. Furnace serviced at the Annex.
- 4. Due to cold mornings propane auxiliary heater had to be brought to the Acra Community Center and ran to warm the building. New windows and insulation needs to be installed.
- 5. Pipes froze and broke at the Acra Community Center. Installed new fittings.
- 6. Due to the amount of service/repair work that is needed on highway equipment, we will not be able to service Ambulance vehicles at this time.
- 7. Due to the extreme weather the concrete library sidewalks have heaved. They are temporarily closed.
- 8. Meeting with security alarm company at Town Hall.
- 9. Town Park, walking path and recycling center has been maintained, plowed, sanded and kept open after all snow events.
- 10. Repairs needed to the library alarm system. Parts are ordered
- 11. We will be reviewing outstanding FEMA projects to be completed this year.



As an assessor we are often asked to take a look at an appraisal that was prepared for a taxpayer. In critiquing or reviewing these reports we may ask ourselves, what is this appraiser doing? This is a really bad appraisal. Well you didn't really expect to see a good appraisal on the property did you? You're the Assessor.

Although our job is about values it always comes down to taxes. The easiest way to reduce property taxes is to find the appraiser that champions the cause, and pro-vides a report that has an agenda. Yes this is un- ethical and can even be illegal. I truly believe almost all appraisers are very ethical and will never work this way. However in every profession there are some shady characters and often these are the reports the assessor sees.

In this seminar we will examine the telltale signs of an appraisals that are intended to mislead and the reports that are truly objective. We will learn the most common ways an appraisal can mislead; this is accomplished by techniques like "Death by a thousand cuts" or the Omission.
